

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE DEARBORN HEIGHTS CITY COUNCIL

JUNE 5, 1995

95-261 The meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m., by Council Chairman Daniel S. Paletko.

Roll Call showed the following:

Present: Councilman Robert L. Brown, Councilman David C. Brunell, Councilwoman Margaret M. Horvath, Councilman Joseph V. Kosinski, Council Chairman Daniel S. Paletko, Councilman Sutika.
Absent: None.
Also Present: Mayor Canfield, City Clerk Sheridan, Comptroller Barrow, Assessor Welch, Public Service Administrator Blackburn.

Council Chairman Paletko read the Notice of Public Hearing.

The City Council of the City of Dearborn Heights will hold a public hearing on a proposed increase of 0.0793 mills in the operating tax millage rate to be levied in 1995.

The hearing will be held on Monday, June 5 at 7:00 P.M. at 6045 Fenton, Dearborn Heights.

The meeting to take action on the proposed millage will be immediately following this public meeting.

If adopted, the proposed additional millage will increase operating revenues from ad valorem property taxes 1.14% over such revenues generated by levies permitted without holding a hearing. If the proposed additional millage rate is not approved the operating revenues will increase by 0.3786% over the preceding year's operating revenue.

The taxing unit publishing this notice, and identified below, has complete authority to establish the number of mills to be levied from within its authorized millage rate.

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Chairman Paletko opened the Public Hearing to the audience for questions and or comments. Hearing none, he asked that the Public Hearing be closed.

95-262 Motion by Councilman Brown, supported by Councilman Kosinski, that the Public Hearing be closed.

Motion unanimously adopted.

The Public Hearing for increasing property taxes closed at 7:13 p.m.

Council Chairman Paletko called for a 15 minute recess. The meeting reconvened at 7:30 p.m. for the 1995-96 City Budget adoption with Councilman Zulinski present.

95-263 Motion by Councilman Brown, supported by Councilman Kosinski, that the City Council adopt the General Government Fiscal 1995-96 balanced budget in the amount of \$26,080,031.00.

Motion unanimously adopted.

95-264 Motion by Councilman Kosinski, supported by Councilman Brown, that the tax levy for the 1995-96 fiscal year be set at 7.0168 mills.

Motion unanimously adopted.

95-265 Motion by Councilman Brunell, supported by Councilman Zulinski, that 2.3811 mills be levied to finance the voter approved Act 345 Fire and Police Pension Plan for the fiscal year 1995-96 in the amount of \$ 2,272,500.00.

Motion unanimously adopted.

- 95-266 Motion by Councilman Brown, supported by Councilman Kosinski, that the City Council levy an additional 2.4765 mills on the State Equalized Valuation for financing garbage and rubbish disposal for the fiscal year 1995-96.

Motion unanimously adopted.

- 95-267 Motion by Councilwoman Horvath, supported by Councilman Brown, that the City Council levy an additional 1.6510 mills on the State equalized Valuation of Public Safety, as approved by the voters of the City of Dearborn Heights, for the fiscal year 1995-96.

Motion unanimously adopted.

- 95-268 Motion by Councilman Kosinski, supported by Councilman Brown, that the City Council levy an additional assessment for the fiscal year 1995-96 of .1226 mills to satisfy debt requirements established for the Ecorse Creek Pollution Abatement Drain No. 1 with the stipulation that this assessment be collected on the December 1, 1995 County and School Tax Bill.

Motion unanimously adopted.

- 95-269 Motion by Councilman Brunell, supported by Councilwoman Horvath, that the millage approved for solid waste disposal by the electorate in July, 1985, be levied at .8255 mills.

Motion unanimously adopted.

- 95-270 Motion by Councilman Zulinski, supported by Councilwoman Horvath, that the City Council levy an additional assessment of .0995 mills for Sewage Disposal Bond Payment for the fiscal year 1995-96.

Motion unanimously adopted.

- 95-271 Motion by Councilman Kosinski, supported by Councilman Brown, that the City Council levy an additional assessment of .0872 mills for 1971 Sanitation Debt for the fiscal year 1995-96.

Motion unanimously adopted.

- 95-272 Motion by Councilman Kosinski, supported by Councilman Sutika, that the City Council levy an additional assessment of .1834 mills for the Downriver Sewage Disposal System bonds, 1993 Series with the stipulation that this assessment be collected on the December 1, 1995 County and School Tax Bill.

Motion unanimously adopted.

- 95-273 Motion by Councilman Brown, supported by Councilman Zulinski, that the City Council approve the 1995-96 lump sum budget for the District Court in the amount of \$1,101,118.00. Salaries not to exceed amount specified in the budget.
