WHEREAS, the Corner Recordation Act, MCLA 54.201 ET SEQ. (1970 PA 74) the characteristics and placement of monuments at public land survey corners; and

WHEREAS, the Act was amended by 2000 PA 34, which in part expands the requirements for placement and characteristics of monuments; and

WHEREAS, MCLA 54.210 (4) requires that if a corner is located in a public roadway and the roadway is hard-surfaced at the corner, the monument at that corner shall be visible or contained within a visible protected enclosure and shall comply with the requirements of the agency having jurisdiction over the roadway; and

WHEREAS, the City of Dearborn Heights has jurisdiction over certain hard-surfaced roadways in Wayne County; and

WHEREAS, the standard for monuments used in Wayne County's Department of Public Services monumentation policy meets the minimum standard as specified in Act No. 34, Public Acts of 2000, Section 7 and 10; and

WHEREAS, Wayne County's Department of Public Services in compliance with Section 10 (4) of Act No. 34, P.A. 2000 requires that monuments placed in hard surfaced roadways under their jurisdiction be placed in cast iron monument boxes similar to (E.J.I.W.) #2965Z, or an approved equal. Monument boxes shall be installed

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with a proper metal cover and in a manner acceptable to the Wayne County Department of Public Services. Under extenuating circumstances, when the placement of a monument box is not possible or when access to the corner location will create an unsafe condition, a monument may be placed in the roadway at the roadway surface without a prescribed monument box. The Department of Public Services Survey Manager or the Wayne County Remonumentation Surveyor Representative must approve this variation from the standard monument box. In either case the monument will meet the minimum standards of Section 7 and Section 10 of Act No. 34, P.A. 2000.

WHEREAS, for purposes of consistency and uniformity, the City of Dearborn Heights desires to conform to the monumentation standards set by Wayne County's Remonumentation Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Dearborn Heights approves placement, in accordance with Wayne County's Remonumentation Plan and Act No. 34, P.A. 2000 for the placement of monuments in hard surfaced roadways within its jurisdiction.
